ADOPTION PROCESS FOR YOUR FOSTER PET

Currently, all of our available pets are living in foster homes thanks to you and your incredible support of our organization at this time. Here is what you need to know about the adoption process.

COMMUNICATIONS WITH POTENTIAL FAMILIES

- All potential adopters will be directed to email us at **Foster@KCPetProject.org** to let us know of their interest.
- Our team members will then forward the email to you to reach out to them. If you have a highly adoptable pet, you may have several emails. Feel free to create a template with information to email all interested parties.

IN YOUR INITIAL EMAIL

- Tell them about your foster pet, their personality as you've seen it so far, how they're doing in your home, and any basic information you'd like to share with them that we may have provided when you picked up your foster.
- Ask them for more information about their home situation.
- Give them the information that you know for sure. Many will ask if they're good with other dogs, kids, cats, etc. and if you do not know how they would do, you can say that. Our adoptions and animal care teams can help answer questions about transitioning in their new home and introductions with the family and other pets.

MEET N' GREET

- You are more than welcome to jump on a phone call, Facetime, or Zoom meeting with any potential adopters. The great thing about fostering your pet is that you help them find the perfect family for them. These virtual options are great for highly adoptable pets, cats, and kittens.
- If you would like to schedule a Meet N' Greet at the Campus, you can do that at **KCPetProject.org/FosterResources**. *This is required if your foster dog is meeting another dog, so our staff can facilitate this introduction.* During meet n' greets, we ask that you keep 6' of distance between you and the adopter (which is a leash length).

ADOPTION PROCESS

- If your meet n' greet at the campus goes well, we can process the adoption then.
- If an in-person meet is not required, a virtual adoption can be scheduled by the adopter at **KCPetProject.org/Adopt**.
- After a virtual adoption is processed and you dropping off your foster pet to their new home, you can either meet in the parking lot of the Campus or take the pet directly to their new home. We ask that you adhere to social distancing as best you can and take necessary precautions, like the ones listed [here](#).

The adopter will be required to purchase their own leash and collar so that we can reuse the leash and collar the dog has been using in foster. Feel free to send your foster dog with their favorite toy, blanket, etc. but please do not give away crates borrowed from KCPP.
